The link with the Anglo-Levantine communities of Smyrna is more tenous with this cemetery, however it is an important window on this community whose heyday was at an earlier time and some of the tombstones greatly predate any British tombs of the city.

Notes:

- 1. From grave A27, A.B.C.F.M. (American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions), supported by the Congregational church created in 1810 in Boston with a Calvinist tradition, one of the largest American missionary societies and the first to sow the seeds of Anatolian Protestantism. First came to Smyrna 1820 (Pliny Fisk and Levi Parsons)^{1g-p.20}
- 2. From grave C15, mother Eliza Maltass and similarly C8, father Henry P. Borell's grave present in Buca church yard. The daughters of the above British families married into German and Italian families respectively. Another Buca cemetery link is at A13 where Isaac Keun's mother Sarah, who married a Dutch Levantine family has the maiden name Boddington which is the same as that of Margaret Willis.
- 3. The survey area was divided simply as right 'A' and left hand side 'B' of path leading up to the church (now Greek Orthodox 'Aya Fotini') and the rear side of church designated as area 'C' with the numbers increasing from front to back and when in rows from left to right. The area 'C', as detailed in Dutch on a plaque on the church wall are gravestones transferred from 'Felemenk Bahçe' (Flemish Garden) in 1965 and all show serious desecration with no crosses now present. According to the present Dutch Honorary Consul in Izmir, Karel Dutilh, the 'Felemenk Bahçe' cemetery was situated in Kançeşme, next to Tepecik on the road leading to Buca with 2 other neighbouring cemeteries, British and German, with the Moslem and Catholic cemeteries on the right hand side. In all these cemeteries burials were no longer allowed from 1934.
- 4. Grave C4, Louis L. Le Bouvier was both the Dutch consular chaplain and chaplain for Buca in 1885-1898, acting chaplain for Smyrna 1922-1924 and died the same year^{1f-A}. It appears he has two graves with the other being in Bornova (same dates, shortened name), the one being here may have a symbolic purpose as being of late date authorities may not have allowed a burial here. But according to Ft Ron Rogers:

Louis le Bouvier was buried at the Dutch Chapel, as he was a Minister of the Dutch Reformed Church, despite this he looked after Buca for a time and during the interregnum (1922-25) cared for St John's and any British Citizens left in Smyrna.

- 5. From this list it appears the burial dates for this cemetery ranged at least from 1663 to 1874 and for the 'Flemish Garden' 1881 to 1924.
- 6. After negotiations the disused church was handed to the Greek Orthodox community in 1951 which still use it for special services.
- 7. According to information from 'Grandes familles de Greece, d'Albanie et de Constantinople Mihail Dimitri Sturza 1983, page 601, the De Hochepied were of Huguenot French background. Jean-Baptist Hochepied was born in Amsterdam 1634 and in 1668 was a merchant with the Dutch Levant company.
- 8. The death of Adele Marie Van Lennep at Sedikeuy (Seydiköy) in 1867 together with Caroline Werry in 1877, from the Buca cemetery listing shows us this village was inhabited by Levantines during this period.

According to the Dutch Honorary Consul, Karel Dutilh, the former Dutch chapel was built in 1908. This raises the question as to what stood at its place before hand, and where the Dutch community worshipped before, questions that would require research possibly in Holland to unravel as virtually no archives seem to be available at the Dutch consulate.
